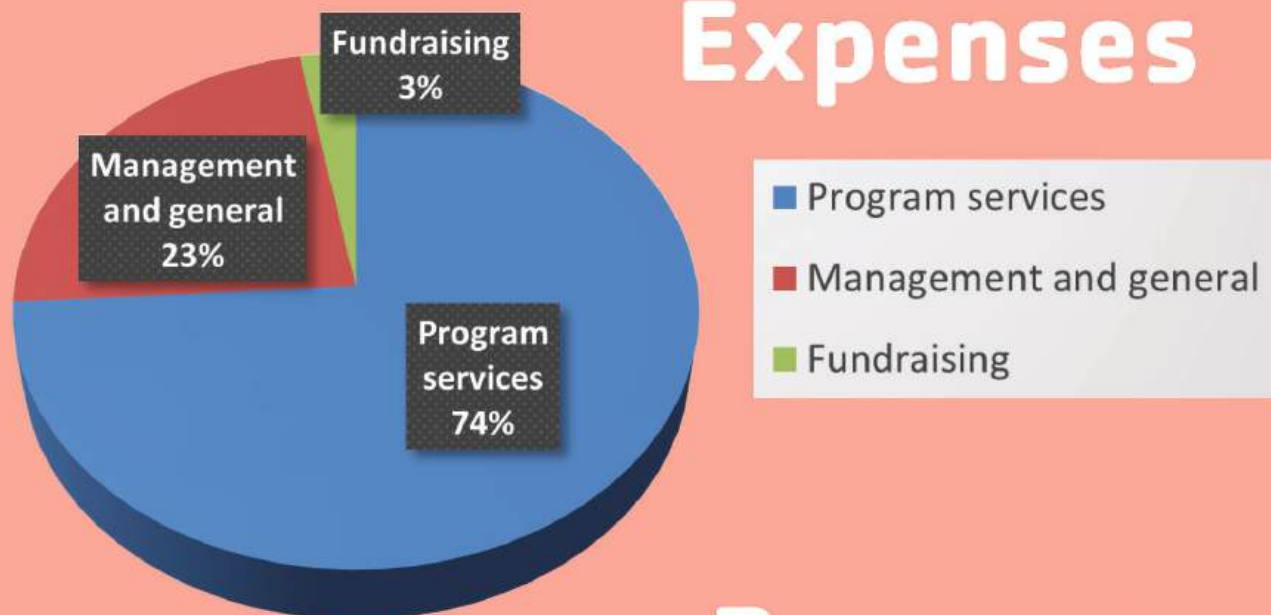

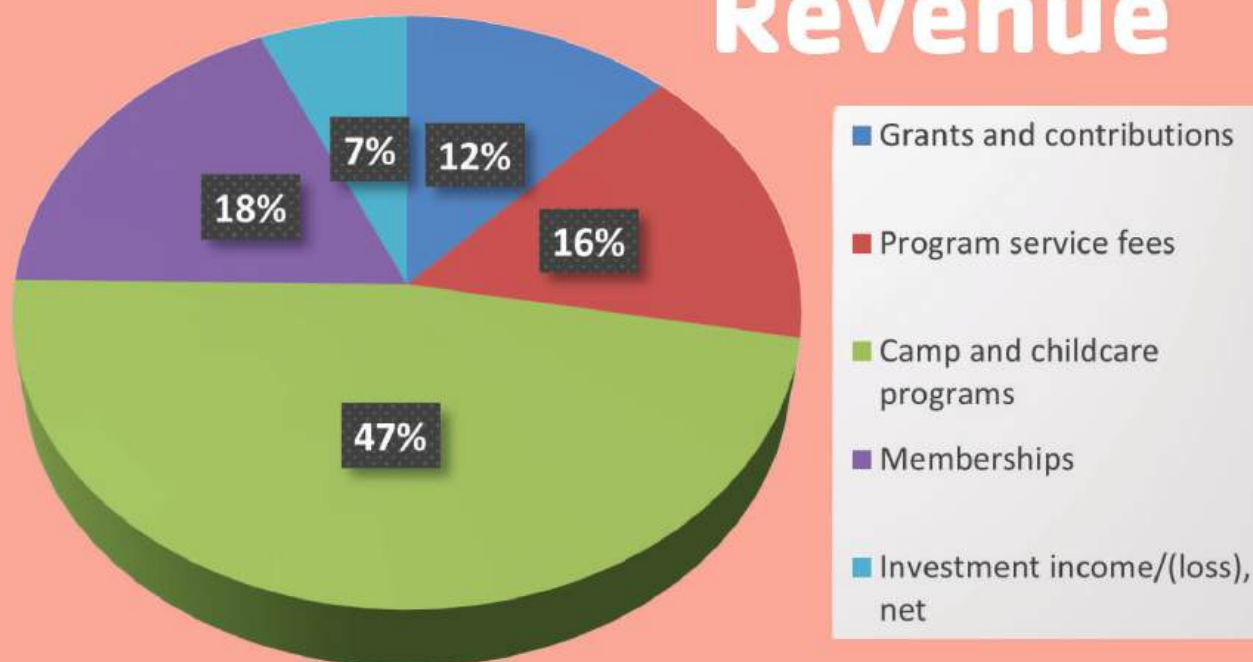
2024 Financial Breakdown
